Many of you have been praying for us as we begin our new mission of reaching the small-scale and subsistence farmers living in SW Tanzania.

Work is moving ahead on the home that we plan to move into in September or October. This home will not just be a place for us to stay but will give us the opportunity to be hosts to many different teams and trainers that will come to assist the people in the area where we will be working. We are constructing an apartment over the dining room/kitchen to house visiting guests.

We need to make our own bricks, make our own window and door frames, as well as haul cement, gravel and rebar from 4 hours away. We also mix our own cement by hand for each part of the construction. My building team lives in tents together as the work proceeds. It is a commitment to build in this place! Some of the construction team helped me in the construction of the Bible School at Mumba that we built starting in 1991. So, we know each other and enjoy working together!
