We remain poised towards our commitment to help the Grace Church in Malawi train men and women who will be capable of leading God's people here in Malawi, especially during these challenging times. While our training outside of Lilongwe has slowed down some due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we remain fully operational in Lilongwe. The very first batch of students who began Malawi Grace Bible School in April 2013 (James Bandah, Fecas Phiri, Yamikani Lefani, and Davis Balala) have now completed their diploma training and are waiting for their graduation on June 19. In the meantime, they are already using their training as fellow instructors at Malawi Grace Bible School. Being missionaries is not always easy but it is so fulfilling to be part of preparing people for ministry and then having the privilege of seeing God use them. Our current Level 1 students (8 in the English program and 6 in the Chichewa program) are currently taking their final classes to complete their Certificate of Ministry training. They too will be
