We thank the Lord that the ministry here in Panama is going well, and we are also doing well as we look forward to all the Lord has in store for us and our ministry in 2026. We are thankful for you, our ministry partners, and want to share with you what the Lord has been doing over the past six months in Panama.

In November, we were blessed with the opportunity to spend time in Costa Rica at a ministry retreat with our Grace Ministries International (GMI) team member, Cecy Torres, as well as fellow GMI missionary families from Nicaragua. It was a refreshing and encouraging time filled with rest, solid teaching, and meaningful fellowship. Following the retreat, we spent time in Guanacaste, Costa Rica, visiting Pamela's family.

When we arrived back in Panama, we began wrapping up another year of ministry at Comunidad Bíblica de la Gracia (Grace Bible Community), hosting several activities to celebrate the end of the year and the holidays. Since it is customary in Panama for people to travel and spend time with family from mid-December to mid-January, we typically have a one-month break from ministry activities to rest, regroup, and plan the new ministry year. We also celebrated our second wedding anniversary on December 18th! We are incredibly thankful for the way God brought us together and has blessed us throughout our first two years of marriage.

We praise God that He has been opening doors for us, both relationally and evangelistically. We've met many new people and have seen opportunities develop to share Christ through our everyday connections and interactions. We joined a local running group a few months ago, which has led to meaningful relationships with some of the group members who have begun attending our young adult group and Sunday services. Through these connections, Anthony noticed a growing interest among our contacts to learn English. In response to this, Anthony will begin an English club and provide English classes at the church beginning in February. Through this, we will both serve the community and build intentional relationships centered around the gospel.

Seeing new faces at our church services has been encouraging! During the holidays, we were deeply blessed to be invited into the home of a family from the church to share a Christmas meal with them. It is not common here to invite people into your home unless they are family or close friends, so this was a significant sign of the trust and depth of the relationship they felt with us. It is exciting to hear people talk about how close and connected they feel at church.

Outreach continues through regular time spent in the community, sharing the gospel and inviting others into church life. We've also been encouraged by visits from friends and fellow believers, including a young couple, Cristian and Carla, who are from a GMI-affiliated church in Mérida, Mexico. They separately served alongside us for several months, which was a true blessing and encouragement for us and the ministry here.

Pamela has remained active in the women's ministry, discipling women and helping organize church activities. It has been a joy to see growth and increased involvement among the women, and we are excited for what God will continue to do in this ministry.
