In April, we gathered Zone Youth Directors for another training. Each year we meet, train, review, and learn how to better serve the church youth leaders in their assigned zones. We had a great time together and I was encouraged to hear that some of them are making progress in their zones as more youth groups are meeting weekly for Bible Studies. More than ten groups have finished the first Bible Study book, which means they have been faithfully meeting for more than fifty sessions to get from Genesis through Numbers. God's Word is good and it can change lives. These men are now back in their home areas and have begun to train or refresh teachers in their zones who work in local churches with the youth groups. They are also planning for several youth conferences this year during the school holidays. Continue to pray that God would raise up leaders who are faithful and able to serve in youth ministries, conferences, and local churches.

As always, it takes many meetings to move ministry forward. We have had an abundance of meetings together as missionaries, with the National Church Youth Department, and several committees all in an effort to serve the Lord and His church. It seems there is always more work than we can accomplish and we would love to have more missionaries join our team!

One of the highlights of the many meetings we have had in recent months was the opportunity to gather together with our fellow missionaries that serve with Grace Ministries International throughout Africa. We met at one of my favorite vacation spots in Tanzania, on the northern tip of Lake Malawi. It was a good time of refreshment, fellowship, and catching up with former coworkers and friends. Although I must confess that I could hardly speak any Swahili no matter how hard I tried; it all came out mixed with Chichewa words and grammar! *Continue to pray for our Missionary team as we seek to serve the Lord and share His goodness with many. Pray that the Lord would raise up more workers for the field.*

Sadly, Malawi made international news headlines in March as Cyclone Freddy devastated the southern part of the country. More than six hundred people lost their lives and hundreds of thousands of people lost their homes. Those who were displaced from their homes took shelter in schools, churches, and mosques as the rains continued for many days. We had more than three hundred fifty families in our churches whose homes were damaged or destroyed. Many who were hit hard by the wind and rains of Cyclone Freddy were also hit by cyclones in 2022, and again this year many crops and farm fields were damaged or destroyed.

We immediately sought to assess the damage and determine what could be done to provide aid to the members of our churches. We were able to help by providing food, plastic sheeting to keep out the rain, and blankets to those whose homes were damaged. In addition, we provided even more resources for some of those who were completely displaced from their homes. We are almost finished with a detailed survey of these village church members' farms and homes to learn how we can continue to help those with the greatest needs. We estimate that many will suffer from hunger as the year progresses. Some of the early reports show that their harvests were limited, and many will deplete their food supplies by July or August. We hope to raise funds that will allow us to assist with food distribution during these difficult times to show our love and support to those who are in need.
