Thank you for your commitment to the work of Grace Ministries International around the world. One of the tangible ways we in the home office and our missionaries have seen your outpouring of generosity year after year is your selfless giving towards the Christmas projects we publish in this annual catalog. Knowing that you carefully and prayerfully consider which projects to invest in blesses the entire GMI family.

Looking back over the last year, GMI has taken several steps towards reaching its Vision 2023 goals. Simply put, by the year 2023 we want to open a total of eight new fields, send out 16 U.S.-based missionaries or missionary families, and send 10 international missionaries or missionary families. GMI personnel and affiliated churches around the world have taken survey trips this year into both Panama and Burundi investigating these two countries as potential future fields. Mozambique is another country GMI has targeted with additional ministry and survey trips with the hope of opening this country soon. It would join Bonaire, Nicaragua, and Paraguay as new GMI fields. We have also added missionaries to the GMI family. So far this year two veteran missionaries couples who formerly served with GMI—Tom and Michelle Sanchez (East Africa) and Frosty and Cathy Hansen (Bolivia)—have been approved by the GMI Board to serve anew with us.

As GMI grows, so do our needs. Having more needs does not concern us as much as it excites us! It means that we are being stretched as we reach more and more with God's Word and His saving grace. We also know that the Lord has provided us with faithful ministry partners just like you who have supplied the financial resources required to continue pressing forward. The projects in this catalog are designed to help us continue moving ahead as we seek to equip local believers to evangelize, plant churches, train others, and share God's love through acts of mercy.

There are projects of all kinds and amounts geared to appeal to a wide range of interests and meet a variety of spiritual and physical needs. Please consider selecting a project to support or challenge your church, Sunday school class, family, or coworkers to provide the funds for a project or two. Even if you cannot give the full amount for any one project, your contribution combined with the contributions of others may very well meet the goal. ### **ATV Wheelchairs for Tanzania**

SIDO, a company in Dar es Salaam, is making wheelchairs for people living in Tanzania who need help getting around. It is quite an amazing place with 3-4 men—with limited use of their legs from either accidents or polio—working with grinders and welders making 3-wheel wheelchairs that are quite strong and durable using bike parts! The wheelchairs last through 5-6 years of hard use in Tanzania in off road conditions and are easily repaired by simply buying bike parts locally and swapping out the broken parts for new ones. The cost to buy and transport a 3-wheel wheelchair 700 miles to the Rukwa Valley is \$600. There are several people in the remote Rukwa Valley who could really benefit from using one of these wheelchairs.

What a great Christmas gift this would be! Paipi Kipele, an evangelist from Ilemba village, with a wheelchair given as a Christmas gift last year. His previous wheelchair lasted 6 years! He's revving his new one up and ready to GO!

### **Reading Glasses for Tanzania**

### **Kiswahili and Kisukuma Treasures**

"All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful...." We believe in God's Word and its transformative power and want to get it into people's hands in their mother tongue. The Treasure is a portable device which carries an audible version of the Bible in a particular language. The Treasure is intended to reach oral learners and people who may not be able to read a Bible on their own. There is a built-in solar panel on the back of The Treasure to recharge the battery. Your gift of \$17 will give the Word of God in audio form in the language of people who cannot read. This is an ongoing project.

### **Outreach to Panama**



Grace Bible Church in Alajuela, Costa Rica hopes and prays to eventually begin a ministry in Panama by sending their own missionaries there. As the church works towards this goal, they are planning two trips in 2017 of three days each for ten people each trip—\$400 will cover the expenses of each trip after the team members and the church contribute towards the expense of the trip. During these trips the teams will do survey work, interview people using questionnaires, share the gospel, look for areas of need, identify places where it could begin a ministry, and pray for God's leading. Already in 2016 the church has taken one survey trip and is planning another in December.

### **Puerto Rico Camper Scholarships**

\$50 donations to help kids from the barrio (neighborhood) go to camp! Most of the kids who receive these scholarships are from low-income families who can't afford to pay the money for camp. This money will be used to help kids who are regular attenders of Club Maravilla and our Bible program.

# OUTREACH AND EVANGELISM PROJECTS

### Bikes for Malawian Leaders Involved in Evangelism



\$125/bike

This project is to buy bikes for key Malawian leaders who are involved in evangelism. This will assist them as they take God's grace to new preaching points and to encourage established churches as they grow in His grace. Most of the churches affiliated with GMI are located in rural areas where it is very hard to find any kind of public transportation. You can provide one bike for \$125 (this includes 1 spare chain, sprocket, tire, and tube). A total of nine bikes are needed to help spread the good news of God's grace in Malawi.

#### Generator and PA System for Outreach in Mwanza

Paul writes about reaching the Romans and says he is "eager to preach the gospel" to them. In the same way the GMI missionary team is eager to proclaim the death, burial, and resurrection of our Savior Jesus Christ in the areas surrounding the Mwanza Region. A generator and PA system will allow the team to hold "open air" evangelistic meetings on a large scale in a remote village or even hold a service in a small church. This package will expand our ability to reach and impact the people God puts in its path for His glory.



### OUTREACH AND EVANGELISM PROJECTS Congo Evangelism

Though GMI has not had a missionary presence in Congo since 2013, GMI continues to maintain a relationship with the Grace Churches in Congo. Evangelists from the churches will often walk, ride bikes, take motorcycles,

and navigate the rivers of this country to share the gospel in the remotest villages. These men go doorto-door, show films, work in schools, and employ a



variety of other methods to share about Christ's death and resurrection as the only sacrifice for sins. From time to time, the Grace Churches in Congo request financial help for these evangelistic efforts. GMI's goal is to raise \$5,000 for these ongoing projects.



## BUILDING PROJECTS Roof a Church in Mwanza, Tanzania

GMI is currently involved in two church plants in the city of Mwanza. It is a struggle for new believers to build their own church. You can encourage them by committing to help roof these churches after they themselves have put significant effort into building floors, walls, doors, and windows—\$1100 is enough to buy three bundles of corrugated tin and the boards necessary to roof a single church.

### **Build a Perimeter Wall in Nicaragua**





During the summer of 2016 three U.S. mission teams worked hard to erect one third of a perimeter security wall on the property which will be the home of GMI's first church/ministry center in Nicaragua. Three hundred and twenty meters of wall remain to be built so construction can start on the building which the church will begin to use for their various meetings throughout the week— \$14,775.

### **Tanzania Farmer Training Scholarships**

A man or a woman and their family in Tanzania will benefit greatly from farming training. The "hands on" classes of *Farming God's Way* teach improved techniques which are helping people attain greater harvests and become better stewards of the Godgiven resources they have. Grace Community Development & Education, created through the leadership of GMI missionary Mike Caraway provides this essential farming training.

The business lessons are based on a biblical worldview and provide participants with the skills and resources to develop sustainable business skills and break the cycle of poverty. Grace Community Development & Education, created through the leadership of GMI missionary Mike Caraway, provides the business training.



# EDUCATIONAL PROJECTS



### Reading, Writing, Arithmetic in Tanzania

Children, young people, and adults in Tanzania who cannot read and write could receive four days of classes per week under the tutelage of a literacy teacher. Some of those who have received these classes have re-entered the school system and received a formal education. Others have started small businesses to help their families—\$60 helps to pay a literacy teacher for an entire month—\$15 helps to provide chalk, pens and paper for three months of classes.

### Tanzania Regional Bible Schools Financial Assistance



The Grace Church of Tanzania operates Bible Schools in ten different locations throughout the country. Each school teaches eight 3-week modules over a two-year period. To graduate 10-20 students from one of these schools costs \$1,450. GMI strives to cover \$420 of this budget with the Grace Churches of Tanzania covering the rest. Helping with less than 30% of their overall budget is a tremendous encouragement and enables them to keep equipping leaders for the work of the church.

# EDUCATIONAL PROJECTS

### Grace International Bilingual Nursery and Primary School (GIBNAPS) in Cameroon - Computers

A Computer Lab for GIBNAPS is a strong outreach project for Cameroon. Every serious and forward-looking school in Cameroon has a computer lab and those that do not can suffer from enrollment setbacks. With a computer lab GIBNAPS will boost its image and attract more pupils. The current population of the school stands at 260 pupils. One computer will cost \$415. We believe that one computer can service at least 45 pupils in a week. This means that this particular project will need at least 6 sets.

### Grace International Bilingual Nursery and Primary School (GIBNAPS) in Cameroon - Playground Equipment



The goal is to purchase three different sets for the school playground: merry-go-round; a swing set; and a slide. One set of playground equipment will service at least 85 pupils each week. Each of these sets of equipment costs \$519. Based on the total number of pupils of 260, we need 3 sets for this project.

### CHILDREN AND YOUTH MINISTRIES KidsGames T-Shirts for Costa Rica

Every year in July the GMI-affiliated churches in Costa Rica put on *KidsGames* which is an outreach where 300-400 kids from Alajuela and 250 kids from Belén, ages 6-12 years, come each day during the week to learn godly values from the Bible and a skill in some particular area such as a sport or a craft. Each child receives a colorful shirt at the beginning of the week to indicate they are part of *KidsGames*. Many families have started to attend each of the churches over the years because of this event where children hear the Word of God, play games, and sing while Christ is the center.

### Chairs for the Ministry in Nagarote, Nicaragua

The ministries in Nagarote are growing and the number of available chairs is often not enough. Ten more chairs are needed so new people who come to visit will have a place to sit. The chairs cost \$18 each.

Camp Buena Vista is in need of some new mattresses for the bunks in the cabins. With ministry taking place year round there is an urgent need for replacing some of the old mattresses which are in terrible shape. Total need \$1,682 about \$37 per mattress.

They are transported from their home village to and from staff training and camp. They are fed; and given a staff T-shirt, soap, flashlights, and other supplies for their time away from home. They also receive a small thank you gift for their time of ministry.








### "Understanding Your Bible" by Craig MacDonald in Swahili

#### **General Fund**

Grace Ministries International is able to carry out its mission of sharing God's grace with the world because of the generous provision of God's people. Our missionaries are at the front working with and training others to carry on the battle. 
