Thanks to all of you who are involved in the work of God in Nicaragua. I thank God very much because He has given me the privilege of serving Him in Nicaragua full time.

I also thank God because you have me in your prayers every month and I thank you for your financial support. All of the project goals have also been met.

Thank God the first, second, and third stages of the well project are already in place. I am praying and also working on the third and fourth stages which would be the purchase and installation of an irrigation system and planting trees. The dream is finishing this irrigation system and planting about 150 lemon trees—then with the fruits of the harvest we can sell lemons and use the money to cover the fixed expenses of the land.

“I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow. The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and they will each be rewarded according to their own labor” (1 Corinthians 3:6-8).

We were able to go on our first trip to Honduras this year. We were able to support various Bible studies that are already taking place there and we were also able to teach the Word of God in a garbage dump. We were able to meet many new people. For example, we met ministry leaders who were very willing to assist us. If God allows it this year, we will be making another trip at the end of October of this year.

On this trip I was able to make contacts in El Paraíso, Langue Valle, and Aramecina. In Aramecina we were able to witness a soccer tournament and, thank God, we were able to connect with many youth between 13 to 18 years old. The contacts we had in Aramecina were a couple of leaders who organize soccer tournaments with the youth of the community.



On the next trip we will be meeting more people and making more contacts. The objective is going to be where little by little more people get involved and we can do small Bible studies and work towards discipleship.

In general, here in Nagarote I am discipling three boys and each one of them can have incredible po-

Meanwhile, here in Nagarote we continue working on being and making disciples of Jesus to teach young people to walk with Jesus. We are working on one-on-one discipleship and taking advantage of youth groups, children, adults, and seniors each week.

We also need to be praying for the situation here in Nagarote for Covid-19 as many people are dying, but worst of all is that many of those people are dying without Christ.

- Wisdom to be able to finish the project.
- For the next trip to Honduras.
- For the disciples and the people with whom we are working here in Nicaragua.
