In Burundi, the GMI team of Tom and Michelle Sanchez and Method and Omelina Mwendapole are developing relationships with various churches, leaders and denominations in the country which are open to receiving further theological and leadership training. The team is in the beginning stages of developing a regional Bible school program for Burundi to teach pastors, church leaders and others more about the distinctions between law and grace and the ministry of the Body of

Christ in contrast to the ministry of Israel by teaching them the story of the Bible. The GMI team is looking forward to helping these believers and churches have a more profound understanding of God's grace and then partnering together to share this grace with others.

Malawi provided the model for the Burundi team's approach to regional theological education. Recently, GMI team member Bill Vinton finished the writing, translation and printing process for two new courses that will be used in the Bible school curriculum. He is also starting to teach a course on dispensational theology at the Lilongwe campus. Pray for the Bible school team as they travel this spring to various parts of the country bringing courses to current and new students who live in these areas.
