Much of the past few months of our ministry in Bolivia has been energizing. We have been involved in the birth of a new ministry and watched this dream flourish. We have witnessed the emergence of young leaders and renewed commitment of established pastors. There is much to share, but here are a few snippets.

Centro Bíblico de la Gracia

Offering classes in the Centro Bíblico de la Gracia has been a dream come true! Our calling to return to Bolivia was in response to the request of the Misión Evangélica Bethesda (MEB) for assistance in establishing effective training for a new generation of Bolivian pastors and church leaders to strengthen existing churches and expand their ministry.

This became a reality in late July when the new training center facility was officially dedicated to the Lord. There was a genuine air of excitement among the pastors and church leaders present as we reflected on God’s faithful provision and the need for those present to dedicate ourselves to the task of reaching Bolivia and the continent with the message of God’s grace through Jesus Christ.

Just over 24 hours later Frosty led the inaugural class as he resumed his studies with MEB pastors in the area of pastoral theology, the final series of three areas of study in preparation for their ordination.

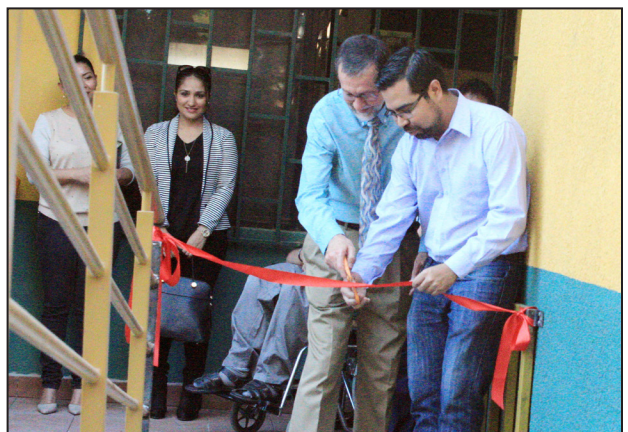

Our desire is to present a full schedule of classes for 2019, depending on the availability of teachers. In the meantime, we have offered three multi-session workshops to strengthen local church ministries. The response has been overwhelming, to the point where late-registrants had to be turned away from a teacher training workshop due to lack of space.

The workshop which drew the most attention was the Worship Summit. Led by a team from the States – Pastor Jonathan Blycker, Jeff Johnson, and Adam and Danae Wolf – the sessions addressed everything from the nature and purpose of worship to the correct use of sound systems. It was encouraging to see our guests connect so well with members of our church worship teams, many of whom asked pertinent questions on how to enhance the ministries in their churches.

Our current need is restocking the library. Commentaries and reference books which were part of earlier training facilities have been lost or are badly worn. Our desire is to purchase additional books for a functional library by early next year.
