Something Is "Gestating"!

As I write this letter our son Teofilo is just a few weeks away from being born after 34 weeks in "gestation". During this time he has been in Raquel's womb but we have not been able to see him. We have seen the changes in Raquel's body and we have made the necessary adjustments in our diet. In preparation for his birth, we have read about his development and the birthing process and have gone to the doctor every month. We have also prepared our home and purchased the clothes and items needed for his arrival. But we still haven't seen him. The reason we have not seen him is that he has been in "gestation", which is defined as the process of formation or development over a period of time. Teofilo has been in the process of growing into a fully developed human life that has a divine purpose and immeasurable value. **It has been a long, difficult, continually changing process**



of growth over the past nine months that we trust will end with much rejoicing as we see him for the first time!



I can also see the process of gestation in what is happening in our lives and ministry here in Nicaragua. Something is gestating in our maturity and after eleven years of marriage God is about to change our lives in terms of our love, service, patience, and suffering. 
Something is also "gestating" in our local church in Nagorote! After ten years of ministry, we have seen a slow but steady spiritual growth in the people of the church. After many

- Eynerd and his family accepted the challenge to pastor the Nagarote church and the Lord provided other leaders to serve alongside him.
- Families are already beginning to commit to the mission and vision of the church.
- Hamilton and Sharon want to be part of the leadership of the church in Nagarote and are considering the possibility of going to another country to serve the Lord.
- The team of GMI missionaries in Nicaragua are working together and the Lord has supplied more missionaries to join in the work here.
