Mwankuba Church Plant

Many of you are aware that in December a problem developed in the organizational relationship between the National Church in Tanzania and Grace Ministries International (GMI) that resulted in three of our missionary families being kicked out of the country. The process of reconciliation is ongoing, but when our residence visa expired in late April we were forced to return home to the States until these issues could be worked out.

Though for us there are many concerns and unanswered questions, we are choosing to view this sudden change as an opportunity and a blessing. We will be living in the Grand Rapids area for one year where Steve is thrilled with the opportunity to work full time on writing, translating, editing, and formatting Swahili literature. We have 47 books that need to be printed in Tanzania and made available for free download on the internet. This was already a part of our job description, but it was very hard to devote much time to it when faced with the daily challenges of church planting.

In addition, we welcome the opportunity to be near our extended family and to have our two adult children live with us for the year. Steve will also be used by GMI to conduct some survey trips into possible new fields with the first trip being to Ghana, West Africa, in the early fall.
