grandparents. Perhaps lost is too

strong a word, yet our hearts still ache without them here. We are thankful for their faithfulness, friendship, and service, and are excited to see what the Lord has in store for them.

Since writing in June, our lives have been a veritable whirlwind.

I, Cory, have taken many trips to Mumba, Sumbawanga, and the Rukwa Valley visiting other missionaries and having meetings with church leaders. It was exciting to

About one month ago, one of the local pastors knocked on our door with some corrected Bible lessons from the prison. He told me that there were several inmates on

The Grace Church of Tanzania is also in the process of attaining government permission to work within the prison system. One of our goals as missionaries is to entrust

and pass our ministries to local partners. It is encouraging to see their desire to meet the spiritual and physical needs of their incarcerated countrymen and women.
