This venture is evangelistic in nature as most of the women in the class are not members of the Grace Church. So whenever we meet, Pastor Malongo Evans, pastor to the Area 44 Grace Church and one of our Bible school students, shares the Word with these ladies for 30 minutes. I also teach an average of 12 women in Area 38 every other Tuesday. We are receiving numerous testimonies of how the business training is transforming the businesses of the ladies. 
