


Grace Ministries Around the World

- In Puerto Rico, 30 kids and youth attended an Easter program in Barrio Singapur where they learned about Passover and were led through the "stations of the cross." GMI missionary, Kaylah Fosnot, shares that, "One kid came to know the Lord while another was very much impacted and decided to commit authentically to Christ."
- On the island of Bonaire, GMI partners. Carlos and Denise Brunk, invited people to their home on Good Friday. They showed the film *Fireproof* in their front yard—26 from their discipleship classes, radio audience, neighbors, and other acquaintances attended the event and heard the gospel of Jesus Christ. The Brunks' Saturday morning radio program has been stretched from 45 minutes to a full hour. Denise is also sharing Bible stories in two community centers. Before Easter, three children believed the gospel message. Pray for Carlos and Denise as they continue to share the gospel and disciple new believers in their faith.

- Traveling to Australia, GMI missionary, Dan Reed, and GMI Executive Director, Jeremy Clark, visited retiring GMI missionaries, Andy and Jeneane Hollier, and the ministry there. On Easter Sunday, Dan preached at Grace Bible Church in the city of Penrith. GBC has been supporting the Reeds and their ministry in Bolivia for several years. It was an encouragement both to Dan and to the members of the church to hear about the Reeds' ministry and to receive Dan's inspirational message about our Lord's resurrection.
- In Malawi, GMI Partner Eric Mango has been working alongside a church in Lilongwe to plant another church in the village of Kaluwila in the Dowa district; This is an area Eric visited back in January when he and his team showed the Jesus Film and preached the gospel resulting in over 200 people responding to the message by putting their trust in Jesus.

- Evangelism in Congo. The gospel continues to go forth through the "1,000 Kids for Christ" campaign. During a recent 3-month push, over 350 accepted the gospel. The evangelism team covered 87.5 miles by bike and foot over terrible roads. In six locations, team members handed out tracts and talked with nearly 900 people about the way of salvation. Another 3,670 people saw the God-Man movie in one of eight showings. Three 2-day conferences were held and attended by 2,640 Congolese. The team also visited nine schools where they were able to pass out 2,152 One-Hope booklets to the students and give 839 books to chaplains and teachers who will use them during the year as they teach mandatory religion classes. Pray for these committed servants who carry on because of the passion God has given them though they face many difficulties.
- Zambia. In March, GMI missionary, Tim Meier, took 20 deaf young people to Lusaka for evaluation. The doctor evaluated these youth free of charge and seven of the deaf were given hearing aids! Tim made this contact after hurting his shoulder last year and visiting the doctor. The doctor asked him why he was living in Zambia which afforded Tim the opportunity to tell him about their ministries. The doctor then

offered to examine all of the deaf the Meiers are working with in Kabwe.

- Outreach in Malawi. GMI Partners, Eric and Mercy Mango, are encouraged by the growth of their literacy program which started with four ladies and now has expanded to 35 students. They are also conducting a sewing class at the Area 36 property in Lilongwe. Their youth volleyball team, the Grace Spikers, is leading Division B in a country-wide league. Their team's success even made the newspaper.

Potential scholarship recipients would first apply to GMI as missionaries, and upon approval, would receive a scholarship to complete the Certificate of Basic Bible Studies (30-hour program) which can be earned entirely through distance studies.
